Job Title: SEND Teaching Assistant (Intermediate)

Reports to: Teacher

Location: Raise Education & Wellbeing School (multi-site & community)

Working Pattern: 35 hrs a week 8.30am-4.20pm Mon-Thurs & 8.30am-2.30pm Fri. Term time only [plus 10 days equivalent inset training].

Job Purpose:

To support the engagement, wellbeing, and learning of pupils with SEMH/ASD under the guidance of teachers and senior support staff. The role focuses on delivering consistent, structured support and contributing to safe, relational practice across the school provisions.

Key Responsibilities:

1. Support for Pupils

- Build positive, consistent relationships with pupils with SEMH and/or ASD needs.
- Support emotional regulation and engagement using agreed strategies.
- Contribute to the implementation of EHCP and support plans.
- Adapt communication to support understanding and inclusion.

2. Learning and Curriculum Support

- Support differentiated learning tasks and scaffold pupil engagement.
- Use agreed visuals, routines, and tools to reduce anxiety and support transitions.
- Provide feedback to teachers and SENCO regarding pupil needs and progress.

3. Environment and Behaviour Support

- Help maintain safe, low-arousal, trauma-informed learning spaces.
- Support with risk management and positive behaviour approaches.
- Supervise pupils in class and during less structured times.

4. Professional Development

- Actively participate in CPD relevant to SEMH/ASD.
- Attend briefings, debriefs and training as directed.
- Seek guidance from experienced and senior staff.

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Safeguarding & Conduct

All staff have a duty to safeguard and promote the welfare of pupils. This role requires strong boundaries, professional conduct, and a calm, emotionally regulated presence in all situations.
